WELCOME BACK!




It's almost time! School will re-open for all children on Monday 8th March and we can't wait. Please read this newsletter carefully. There's lots of information to share with you about our plans, preparation and expectations, over the coming weeks.

We are all looking forward to see the children on Monday. Please follow the same entry and exit routines that were in place before school closed on 4th January. Social distancing measures and all other control measures remain in place.

Please check ParentMail for a special letter for your child, which has been prepared by the staff in each Year team. These letters have been written with the children in mind to help explain what we are planning for their return to school. We would be grateful if you could sit with your child and read this with them. Thank you.

FACE MASKS / ONE ADULT ONLY / SOCIAL DISTANCING

We continue to ask that all parents, older siblings (Upper School age) and other adult family members wear a face mask when on school premises, please (unless you are exempt for medical reasons).





SCHOOL CAR PARK - CLOSED



The school car park **remains closed** to all parents (except those who have a school disabled badge parking permit). Contractors working at the new care home on Church Road have been parking in Mountbatten Drive for some weeks now, making street parking limited after 8am. We strongly suggest parents avoid Mountbatten Drive.

Alternative parking can be found at Ferndown Leisure Centre or Tesco.

















PUBLIC TOILET FACILITIES

We are sorry that we are unable to offer any public toilet facilities. Children's facilities are available during **school time only** but are closed after school to allow for cleaning.



PLEASE RETURN BOOKS / RESOURCES



Please return all school resources which have been borrowed and all reading books on Monday 8th March in your child's book bag. Thank you.

UNIFORM / PE DAYS

All children should return to school in full uniform, please. Long hair (collar length or longer) should be tied back and trainers are not permitted in school. Please ensure your child has a named coat in school. Children should come to school in their PE kit on their allocated PE days.



LATERAL FLOW TESTS FOR PRIMARY CHILDREN

Government advice states that primary school children will not be regularly asymptomatically tested due to low levels of transmission between younger aged children but will continue to need to come forward for tests if they have symptoms. Parents now have the option to order simple Lateral Flow Tests (LFTs) to their home. More information can be found via the links below:


We look forward to seeing how good the garden will look in the very near future!




REMOTE LEARNING REVIEW


Year Group (Tick all that apply)

105 responses




Is your child learning remotely?









How satisfied are you with communication from school during Covid19 school closure - Jan/Feb 2021?




How concerned are you about your child's mental health, during this period of lockdown? 105 responses

I'd like to address a comment received from a small number of parents who would have preferred us to offer live lessons. We completely understand why some parents think this would have been "better" but we don't share this view.

Every school has had to take into account their individual context when deciding how best to provide remote learning. The classroom experience for young children cannot be replicated by a live video lesson and only a small number of our children would have been able to access this type of learning and gain anything from it.

I hope that we never have to endure another lockdown scenario that brings such disruption to our children's education and to family life.

We know you've done your best to support the children learning at home and the responses we've received demonstrate that the overwhelming majority of our families are very satisfied with our provision during this time too.
